Welcome!

We will officially kick off the 2024 Special Park Districts Forum Monday evening with a Welcome Gathering sponsored by JotForm featuring appetizers, bar, lawn games and more! If possible, plan to arrive early to participate in one of the pre-forum activities including golf, river rafting, bike riding, footgolf or nature-inspired art.

Each day will start with breakfast at the hotel from 7 - 8 a.m. with information and day-of announcements at 7:30 a.m. Buses will leave the hotel at 8:15 a.m. Our helpful staff will be available each morning in the hotel lobby to provide assistance and answer any questions.

After breakfast, we will head out to explore and experience the parks. Attendees will be transported by bus to all session locations, and lunch will always be provided out in the parks. Some days we will stay together as a full group and others we will provide options to explore specific sites based on your interests and focus areas. You will be asked to select your preferred session option, when applicable, during registration.

Evenings will end with dinner at one of our park locations and a hospitality room at the hotel. Please note that dinner on Wednesday is on your own - we will have information on surrounding restaurants, activities, and transportation options available at the hotel.

Following golf (lunch provided at the turn), refreshments will be served at the clubhouse and an overview of our golf enterprise and maintenance operations will be presented.

Suburbs to City: Best of the Twin Cities Bike Tour

Three Rivers Regional Trails

The Twin Cities is known as one of the most bikeable metro areas in the U.S. Join this 36-mile bike ride and explore the regional trail network across two award winning park systems - Three Rivers Park District and the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board. Participants will tour paved trails along the Minneapolis Chain of Lakes, Minnehaha Falls, the Mississippi River, Downtown Minneapolis, University of Minnesota campus and other key destinations! Trails are generally flat with a few small hills.

Lunch and a brewery stop will be provided during the ride. There will be a rest stop halfway through the 4-hour ride and other stops along the route with restrooms and water.

Morning Session Option 1: The Legacy of Outdoor Education

Lowry Nature Center, Carver Park Reserve

Nature-based education is a cornerstone at Three Rivers and there is no better place to learn about our commitment to learning and inspiring curiosity than a visit to Minnesota's first public nature center. Hear how the nature center got its start, take a tour of the building, and learn about some of the amazing programs that Lowry is known for, including summer camps and maple syruping. Also, take a trek out into one of the Park District's restored prairies to learn all about our osprey reintroduction and search with a naturalist for some of the small, six-legged animals that call the prairie home.



Morning Session Option 2: Mountain Biking at Three Rivers Park District

Monarch Singletrack, Carver Park Reserve

Three Rivers Park District features four distinct singletrack trail systems totaling over 50 miles of excitement for off-road cycling enthusiasts. Hear about the history of mountain biking at the Park District and tour parts our newest trail, Monarch Singletrack. Learn about the evolution of trail design, lessons learned and our approach to the ongoing upkeep and maintenance of operating a singletrack trail system. Of course, there will be opportunities to ride the trail and hit the features.

Afternoon Session Option 1: Behind the Scenes of Three Rivers Park District

Baker Park Reserve

Learn about who and what keeps Three Rivers running and explore our campground operations. Spend time at the Baker Operations Center at your own pace; ask questions and meet the people behind the scenes making sure our parks are running smoothly. Explore one of our carpentry shops, view a variety of equipment maintained by our mechanics and learn how our maintenance staff cares for over 27,000 acres of parks and trails.

Take a 10-minute walk over to Baker Campground (shuttle options will be provided) to learn about our various camping options, and amenities, as well as the daily ins and outs of operating a 200+ site campground. You will also have the opportunity to shoot archery and learn about our overnight program center, the Baker Outdoor Learning Center, and their offerings.

At Three Rivers, our 35 lakes, 18 streams and 14 beaches don't monitor themselves. During dinner, take a 'dive' into what we do to maintain them. Join our water quality team at Lake Independence for an evening pontoon ride, walking tour and water surveying experience. Learn about one of Three Rivers' shoreline stabilization projects, our water collection practices, aquatic plant diversity, and survey techniques for aquatic invasive species through hands-on examples.

Morning Session: The Jewel of Three Rivers: Crow-Hassan Park Reserve

Crow-Hassan Park Reserve

This morning is all about natural resources! Join Wildlife and Forestry staff as they showcase the District Nursery, where all the native vegetation planted in the Park District is grown and prepared for planting. Then, take a walking tour of the Crow-Hassan prairie, a 1,200-acre, fire-managed complex that provides the highest quality prairie in the Twin Cities. Natural Resources staff will showcase and discuss many facets of their operations such as tree planting, climbing, and rigging, oak wilt management, prairie restoration, prescribed burns, sensitive species re-introduction and management, and wetland management.

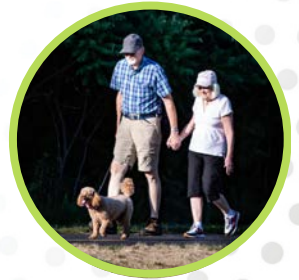
Afternoon Session Option 1: 5,000 Acres of Fun Elm Creek Recreation Area, Elm Creek Park Reserve

The largest park in Three Rivers, Elm Creek Park Reserve truly offers something for everyone. Get a behind-the-scenes tour of the wide variety of amenities available in the park, including the chlorinated swimpond and pump house, chalet, disc golf course and multi-use trail system. Stopping by the play area, you'll see some Landscape Structures equipment in action, and finally, get a peek into our winter recreation operations, highlighting Elm Creek's snowmaking for cross-country and downhill skiing, snowboarding and snowtubing.

Afternoon Session Option 2: Celebrating the Big Year of Bugs

Eastman Nature Center, Elm Creek Park Reserve

For 50 years Eastman Nature Center has offered a variety of insect themed programs to school groups, adults, and families. Explore the different ways we engage audiences through hands-on activities, sharing information in an intentional way. You will participate in learning stations and then pick a focus area to go more in-depth with your learning.



Wednesday, June 12

Afternoon Session Option 3: Building from the Ground Up

Mississippi Gateway Regional Park

Experience the redevelopment of Mississippi Gateway Regional Park, the most significant capital project in the Park District's history. This remarkable \$40 million investment is set to open in 2026. See how it will enrich the community and help people connect with nature and the Mississippi River. Learn about the important role partnerships and community engagement played in developing the plan, see where we are at in the construction process, and hear about key features that will be included such as the Treetop Trail, Mini-Mississippi play feature and more. Plus, get an up-close look at how we operate a recreational run-of-the-river dam and take a walk over the river to see the stunning views of the Mighty Mississippi and surrounding nature.

Morning Session: Nature Play

Richardson Nature Center, Hyland Park Reserve

Richardson Nature Center is a gateway to stunning natural beauty located just minutes from the city. You will experience how we connect visitors to nature through equally engaging facilities, staff, and natural environments. All attendees will have the opportunity to do both stops while at Richardson.

Stop 1: Discover the past, present, and future of this beautiful facility on a staff-led tour. Explore colorful, interactive murals depicting the habitats and wildlife of Hyland Lake Park Reserve and observe local artist Chris Tully adding to the displays. Meet Richardson's resident raptors, reptiles, and amphibians, learn about our solar roof, enjoy "rocking chair birding" in the Wildlife Viewing Room, and sample honey from Richardson's own honeybees.

Stop 2: Visit the Nature Exploration Area to observe one of Richardson's early learning programs for children and their caregivers. Watch how naturalists create an inclusive environment and foster physical, social and emotional development through free play and natural materials and enjoy a half-mile hike to the Turtle Basking Pond and a restored tallgrass prairie that is frequently home to the endangered rusty-patched bumblebee.

Afternoon Session Option 1: Connecting Communities

Nine Mile Creek Regional Trail

The Park District's 175-mile Regional Trail Network connects numerous communities and regional parks, while also meeting a critical need in the greater Twin Cities bicycle transportation system. Learn more about how this multi-use trail system is operated and maintained, plus hear the plans for expansion over the next several decades. During this 6-mile bike ride, participants will see the economic growth occurring around this robust system as we explore the region's newest light rail project while riding the Park Districts' most visited regional trail corridor. Bikes and helmets will be provided.

Afternoon Session Option 2: A Day at the Beach Bryant Lake Regional Park

With 10,000 lakes, summer in Minnesota is often enjoyed on the water. This is your chance to experience all that lake life has to offer. Paddle a canoe, kayak, or stand-up paddle board, wet a line, and do some fishing with our Outdoor Recreation School or just relax on the beach. Looking for something away from the water, throw a flying disc at Bryant Lake's premier 18-hole disc golf course or simply go for a walk on one of the park's trails.
